GRADUATE CERTIFICATE IN GLOBAL STUDIES

The Graduate Certificate in Global Studies is a unique inter-disciplinary initiative between the College of Education and Human Services (CEHS) and the School of Diplomacy and International Relations (DIPL). Upon completing the program, new and experienced teachers will benefit from a broadened worldview and an enriching knowledge about persons and cultures beyond direct experience. Throughout the program, participants engage in the complexities of global communities and institutions.

Why Global Studies?

In recent years, there has been a growing focus on addressing global competence as part of teacher professional development. Globally competent educators are able to investigate the world around them, recognize the perspectives of others, communicate ideas with diverse audiences, and become active participants in improving conditions in their local and global community. Global competence is also reflected in state learning standards for Social Studies, specifically in the model curricula for U.S. and World History taught at the high school level.

The **Graduate Certificate in Global Studies** at Seton Hall University comprises 15 semester credits (i.e., 5 graduate courses). Participants complete 6 fixed credits in CEHS coursework (EDST 7501/EDST 9306) that are taken at the beginning and end of the program. DIPL coursework comprises 9 credits taken in the middle of the program that students select according to their regional or functional specialization interest. **Credits completed for the Global Studies certificate may be applied towards a Seton Hall University MA graduate degree program.**
